AMIROOTED IN THE GOSPEL?

Have you staked your eternity on something you have trouble putting into words? Knowing the gospel is key to effective evangelism, but simply knowing what it says isn't enough. We must be rooted in it, returning to it each day as our source of strength, hope, comfort.

HAS MY HEART BEEN **TRANSFORMED?**

When we hear the truth of the gospel and respond in repentance and surrender, God transforms us, giving us a new heart and new identity. Remembering this transformation and pursuing regular intimacy with God help us to abide in Him each day and regularly produce spiritual fruit.

DOES MY LIFE REFLECT WHAT I CLAIM TO BELIEVE?

A Christlike lifestyle is irrefutable evidence of heart transformation. The way we live shows others what we believe and if we have truly been changed by God. However, the opposite is also true. To effectively reach the lost, a new heart and Christlike life must work together in harmony.

AM I MOTIVATED TO REACH OTHERS?

Examining why we share the gospel protects us from falling into unhealthy habits of laziness, harshness, or silence. Scripture calls us light, ambassadors, and priests to remind us of the intentional part we play. Noticing and actively moving toward the lost is critical to our role in God's mission.

AM I CELEBRATING EVERY GOSPEL CONVERSATION?

Success in evangelism is measured by faithful conversations, not immediate conversions. Whether we plant, water, or harvest, we are called to faithfully pursue others. When we measure success correctly, we can celebrate every gospel conversation. regardless of the reaction.

IS MY PREPARATION **FUELED BY LOVE?**

Planning matters because people matter. Everyone has a point of greatest gospel need—an area in desperate need of hope, forgiveness, or redemption. Discerning the wisest way to pray and share the gospel with others is an act of love and keeps our gospel conversations from becoming presentations.

AM I CONFIDENT IN HOW GOD USES ME?

What is our role in God's mission? What's His role? Is it on our shoulders, or will He take care of it? Why should we even bother if God is in control? Understanding the unique way we join God in His mission and how He measures success protects us from despair and pride and excites us to keep going.

AM I HESITANT TO SHARE THE GOSPEL?

If we know people who need to hear the good news, why is it so hard to share it? Gospel gaps are fears, hesitations, and excuses that stand between our knowledge of the need and our action to do anything about it. Through practice and God's Word, we can overcome our gaps and replace fear with boldness.

EVANGELISM IS NOT AN EVENT. IT'S AN OVERFLOW.

The eight elements of an outwardfocused life are so much more than an evangelistic *method*. They help us develop a lens to see ourselves and others as God intended.

Without this lens, evangelism becomes a task, a product, or a destination.
What was intended to be an everyday overflow mutates into an obligatory event—a job rather than a joy.

Each element plays an important part in developing an outward-focused worldview, a worldview that leads to an outward-focused *life*.

Our hope is that you develop a rhythm of cultivating these eight elements every day, calibrating to God's will, His plan, and His mission:
